# Welcome on board

The Hamburg Public Transport Association (Hamburger Verkehrsverbund/hvv) provides attractive and modern local transport services at reasonable prices. It was the first of its kind in the world when it was founded in 1965 and has been getting people where they want to go in and around Hamburg ever since.

The hvv area extends over about 9,700 square kilometres in the Hamburg metropolitan region and covers Hamburg itself as well as the 8 administrative districts of Steinburg, Pinneberg, Segeberg, Stormarn, Lauenburg, Lüneburg, Harburg and Stade. Hamburg AB comprises the city of Hamburg and a number of surrounding towns and country districts.

In the districts of Cuxhaven, Heidekreis, Lüchow-Dannenberg, Rotenburg (Wümme) and Uelzen, hvv tickets are accepted in regional trains RB/RE and on some buses. In fare rings G and H, the hvv fare system only applies for season tickets.

# A double-track approach

You can reach your destination in comfort by rail, road and river transport. You save time and money, not to mention avoiding the hassle of driving. You are sure to find 1 of our 10,000 bus stops, rapid transit or railway stations somewhere near you.

### Keeping time

We get you where you want to go. Underground and rapid transit services as well as most Metro buses run at 5 to 10 minute intervals in Hamburg AB on weekdays up to about 11 pm.

Underground and rapid transit trains keep running in Hamburg and Norderstedt every 20 minutes through the night from Friday to Saturday and Saturday to Sunday and before a public holiday.

# Our core competence

The rapid transit and regional rail services provide a network of fast, direct connections spanning the hvv area whatever traffic conditions are like on the roads.

# Travel in style

About 820 bus lines run in addition to the rapid transit and regional trains.



### Metro buses (MetroBusse) Lines 1–29

run a service every few minutes connecting you to the rapid transit and regional rail services in Hamburg AB. You can find an overview of the Metro bus lines on pp. 8/9.

# Xpress buses (XpressBusse) Lines X3-X80

provide a direct link with limited intermediate stops to major interchange points and important destinations, so you get where you want to go faster – at no extra charge.



# City and regional lines (Stadt- und RegionalBusse)

get you to the rapid transit and regional rail stations and connect outlying villages and metropolitan districts.

# Night buses (NachtBusse) | Lines 600-688

run Sunday night until Thursday night in most parts of Hamburg and some adjoining districts. At the weekends, they supplement the all-night regular services.

### Ferries (Fähren) | Lines 61-75 | 5160 | 5170

Enjoy a trip with 1 of our 8 ferry services in the Port of Hamburg. Your hvv ticket is valid here, too. You can also use the ferries between Amt Neuhaus (administrative district of Lüneburg) and the west bank of the Elbe.



# **Evening and night services**

"Off we go" is not only the motto during the day in Hamburg, there is loads going on in the evenings and at night, too – and we will take you there so that you can be part of the action. Take the bus or train to the cinema or theatre, the disco or your favourite club – and we will get you back home again.

# Let us take you where the bright lights are

Our buses, rapid transit and regional trains keep going well into the night for you in Hamburg AB. Underground and rapid transit services and most Metro buses run every 5 or 10 minutes up to about 11 pm on weekdays. All services continue until approximately half past midnight.

In the nights from Friday to Saturday and Saturday to Sunday and before a public holiday, all rapid transit lines with the exception of the A3 have an all-night service – at least hourly. Underground and rapid transit services in Hamburg and Norderstedt keep running every 20 minutes through the night at weekends. Not only that, there is a network of special bus services. So go out and have a night on the town – we will make sure you get home safe and sound.

# Night buses

run Sunday night until Thursday night after the rapid transit system closes down (around half past midnight) in most parts of Hamburg and some adjoining districts every half hour or full hour. They supplement the all-night regular services at the weekends and take passengers out to Hamburg's surrounding region. They all meet up at the central junction at Rathausmarkt in front of Hamburg's Town Hall.



# Just stop and get off

In order to get home safely in the evenings, we can offer you a special service. From 7 pm on many buses outside the Hamburg city centre you can just ask the driver to stop where it is convenient for you and get off. This service is available all day on Sundays and public holidays.

Getting off "between stops" means that you get home sooner and have a more comfortable journey in the evenings – and it's safe as houses.

# What you should do

Please remember that the bus driver has to observe normal traffic rules. That means that for your own safety you are not allowed to get off at a red light or in a no stopping area.

- Tell the bus driver where you want to get off in plenty of time. It will then be his decision whether the traffic allows him to stop at the place you want.
- Please only use the front doors when leaving the bus.
- Since it is only possible to ensure safe and uncomplicated unloading of wheelchairs, walkers or prams at regular bus stops, this service is not available for these passengers.



# Put 2 + 2 together

The hvv has cooperation arrangements with many theatres and organisers of concerts and other events. The tickets for these double as a return ticket to get there and back and are valid in fare rings A – F. Please make sure to check that this information is printed on your theatre or entrance ticket.

# **Single Tickets**

1 journey for those who only travel with us now and again in fare rings A - F only, for 1 journey, no return, not transferable

# **Day and Group Tickets**

Travel as often as you like on the same day.

- Most times it pays to get a 9 am Day Ticket even if you only make 2 journeys.
- If you travel in a group, you can save money with a 9 am Group Ticket. This gives you flat rate travel for up to 5 people of any age for 1 day. It is even worth it just if there are 2 of you.

in fare rings A – F only, for as many journeys as you like, transferable, valid until 6 am the following morning.

In fare rings G and H, the hvv fare system only applies for season tickets. Children under the age of 6 and dogs travel free of charge.

# **Buying Single and Day Tickets**

You can obtain Single and Day Tickets from bus drivers, ticket machines, on your smartphone or in the Online Shop at hvv.de/en. You will find ticket machines at many bus stops and every USOB station. N.B.: tickets cannot be bought on the trains.



Tickets do not have to be stamped and cancelled before commencing your journey.





### hvv App

You can call up real time info and buy tickets straight away with the hvv App for iOS and Android. And you get 7% off with every purchase! This does not apply to weekly and monthly season tickets or the Hamburg CARD.

# You've got a ticket to ride

For all those who use our services regularly we offer our weekly and monthly season tickets at budget prices – you choose the start date for your ticket to suit your plans. Monthly season tickets can also be ordered for the whole year: travel for a full 12 months and save nearly 20%. Why not give it a try – there is no risk to you. Information on the trial period for the all-year season ticket under hvv.de/en/trial-period

You can buy the tickets at our hvv service centres, see p. 19. All locations can be found at hvv.de/en. Please make sure to bring along a passport photo. Season tickets are not transferable.

- 24/7 Season Tickets (Vollzeit-Karten)
   A month's travel at a reasonable price
- Off-Peak Season Tickets (Teilzeit-Karten)
   Just right for those who can travel outside peak hours valid for 1 person and 3 children (aged 6–14) Mon-Fri from 9 am to 4 pm and from 6 pm until 6 am the following morning, all day on Sat, Sun and public holidays.
- Season tickets for senior citizens 63+ (Senioren-Karten)
   Valid for 1 person aged 63+. No time restrictions. That means you get much cheaper travel than with a 24/7 season ticket.
- Season tickets for school children, apprentices and students (Schülerinnen, Schüler, Auszubildende und Studierende) Reduced-price season tickets are available for all those attending normal primary or secondary school or in a recognised course of vocational training. School children who live in Hamburg can travel at a particularly favourable price. Info on the Schools Special on p. 16. The super saver for apprentices/trainees is the BonusTicket, available in Hamburg and some surrounding districts (see p. 17). At many colleges and universities, students automatically get a SemesterTicket for fare rings A – E.
- Social discount on tickets

# Season tickets for school children

For children in normal primary or secondary education there are reduced-price monthly and all-year season tickets. You need a hvv entitlement form for this, which must be filled in and then validated by the school. The form can be obtained at any hvv service centre, or often from the school secretariat.

### Additional tickets for siblings

Do you have more than 1 child going to school? Then the first child can get a main ticket and the other(s) an additional ticket. You save about 20% with this arrangement. When you buy the additional ticket you need to show the main ticket as proof of entitlement. These tickets can be obtained at any hvv service centre, see p. 19.

# Schools Special for Hamburg

The City of Hamburg is sponsoring environmentally friendly mobility for all school children living in Hamburg with its Schools Special initiative. All main all-year season tickets for school children get  $\in$  13 off, whatever their area of validity, while all-year sibling season tickets cost  $\in$  5.10 less. That means: Hamburg AB  $\in$  30, 5 fare rings (ABCDE)  $\in$  47.20, entire network  $\in$  80 a month as an all-year season ticket. In Hamburg the distinction between main and sibling all-year season tickets no longer applies. You can find more details under hvv.de/school

# Season tickets for apprentices and students

Apprentices, trainees and students are also entitled to reduced-price monthly and all-year season tickets. They need a hvv entitlement form. The hvv entitlement forms for apprentices/ trainees must be validated by the firm at which they are employed as well as the competent accreditation authority (e.g. the Chamber of Crafts or Commerce). If students have not automatically been issued with a SemesterTicket, they can get a hvv entitlement form and have it validated by their place of education. # BonusTicket for apprentices/trainees

In Hamburg and in some surrounding districts there is now a particularly attractive option: the BonusTicket, available as an all-year season ticket or a ProfiTicket. With this, you can travel for about € 30/month on the entire hvv network. This is possible due to a financial subsidy from the City of Hamburg and/or the surrounding administrative districts. # Cashless payment

You can buy the following tickets by cashless payment with the hvv App or the hvv Card and in the Online Shop:

- Single, day, group and weekly tickets
- Supplementary and bicycle tickets RB/RE
- Upgrade tickets for 1st class on regional trains RB/RE
- the Hamburg CARD

You can also buy the main single and day tickets via the hvv switch App. You get a discount of 7% on every purchase. This does not apply to weekly, monthly and all-year season tickets or the Hamburg CARD.



### The hvv App

You can call up real time info and buy tickets straight away via the hvv App for iOS and Android – this includes monthly season tickets (24/7, off-peak and senior citizens 63+).

### The hvv Card

You can get a hvv Card at the Online Shop and in any hvv service centre. If you have an all-year season ticket, the hvv Card will be sent to you automatically. If you activate the purchase function you can use your hvv Card to buy tickets without cash at a ticket machine or on the bus. It can also be used to buy and extend weekly or monthly season tickets at ticket machines.

### The Online Shop | hvv.de/en

Get your tickets up to 14 days in advance and print them out immediately or save them to your smartphone! In addition you can order your hvv Card here:

- with the purchase function for tickets
- with an all-year 24/7 or off-peak season ticket You will need a digital photo for your hvv Card. We will then send your card by post within a few days.

# **Travel information**

### Find your way

We want you to be able to find your way around without any trouble. That's why we hang maps of the surrounding area and of the city, tariff plans, timetables and plans of the different routes at all our stations. On the underground and the trains, you can quickly find your way around using the plan of the rapid transit and regional train lines (see p. 27).

The next stop is shown or announced in the underground, trains and buses as well as on the ferries so that you do not miss your stop. Constantly updated displays in the rapid transit stations and at many bus stops tell you when the next train or bus is coming.

# Mobility on call



Dial-a-ride taxis or minibuses – Anruf-Sammel-Taxi (AST), Anruf-Sammel-Mobil (ASM) and RufBus – are a special on-demand mobility service in addition to the regular bus services: it varies from region to region and is tailored to meet your needs. In some areas we can even deliver you direct to your door. Information at hvv.de/en/demand and under 040/19 449

# Bike on board

On the underground and rapid transit trains as well as on many bus services you can take your bike free of charge at the following times:

Mon-Fri before 6 am, 9 am-4 pm and from 6 pm, on weekends and public holidays all day. 2 bikes per set of doors can be carried. Please do not block the area in front of the first set of doors. On the buses, please use the middle doors.

For the regional trains RB/RE you need an extra Bicycle Ticket RB/RE (Fahrrad-karte RB/RE) which costs € 3.50 (online € 3.26) per bike for the whole day. It is valid in fare rings A – F. Bikes can be carried on these trains without time restrictions. Please use the doors marked with a bicycle symbol.

You can take your bike on the ferries in Hamburg at any time with no extra charge with the exception of the ferry from Blankenese to Cranz. Please do not take your bike onto the open deck on the ferries. There is a charge levied for taking bikes on the 2 ferries between Amt Neuhaus (administrative district of Lüneburg) and the west bank of the Elbe. On line 5160 (Neu Bleckede – Bleckede) this is € 0.50 and on 5170 (Darchau-Neu Darchau) it is € 1 per journey.

Wheelchair users and persons with walkers or with prams naturally have prior rights. It may therefore happen that you have to get off with your bike if the bus or train is full. The decision here is at the discretion of the driver or other official personnel.

Folding bikes in folded position can be carried free of charge on all services at any time – also on the regional trains RB/RE.

# Have a safe journey

We work in close cooperation with the police and the fire services. When we refurbish a station, it is crucial that it is well lit and laid out so that everything can easily be seen. We make sure that the materials and the design of our constructions come up to the highest safety standards.



# Safety on the bus

If danger threatens, if you are being molested or property is being damaged, please tell the driver. They can intervene immediately and radio for help. Many buses are also fitted with surveillance cameras. The video images can often be directly transmitted from the bus to the traffic control centre. This enables us to appraise situations better and to react faster and more appropriately with emergency measures.

# Safety on the train

Our modern underground and rapid transit carriages are open to the next carriage or have large windows between them. That gives you a clear view through the entire train, eye contact with other passengers and you can feel more secure if you can see what is going on. As well as this all the underground and rapid transit trains have surveillance cameras and there is an intercom system next to the doors to speak directly to the driver. If an incident occurs, you should inform the driver straight away to radio for help immediately. In critical situations call the police (110) or the fire brigade or ambulance service (112): mobile phones have reception in all the tunnels!

# Keeping an eye on things

Surveillance cameras allow our specially-trained personnel to keep an eye on what may be happening on the station platforms. Video material can be used as evidence in court. If there is nothing suspicious on them, the videotapes are wiped clean.



# Security guards

### SOS

There are SOS telephones on all station platforms in the rapid transit network. If you need to, you can get help directly here. As soon as you have pressed the emergency button you are visible on the cameras in the network control centre and our staff there can see what is going on. Even if it is only some information you need – we are glad to help.

The emergency call pillars on the U-Bahn are silver-coloured with a red shining top. In cases of danger to life and limb you can stop underground trains entering and leaving the station by pulling down the emergency lever.



# **Emergency brake**

If the emergency brake in the train is activated, the underground and rapid transit trains will automatically continue till the next station. Help can be given more simply and swiftly there. If the train stops between stations, the door lock can be released by activating the emergency brake. Only get off the train after being instructed to do so by the train staff. Good to know: all the underground tunnels have exit points which are clearly marked.

# No stress while you travel

It is very important to us that you feel safe and well with us. That is why it is strictly forbidden to drink alcohol on board all public transport in the hvv (with the exception of the HADAG ferries as well as DB and nordbahn trains) and at the underground and rapid transit US astations.

# Mobility is for everyone

At hvv.de/en/mip you can find all you need to know about barrier free mobility in the hvv. There are detailed sketches of all stops on the rapid transit and regional rail network in the hvv area with details of entrances and exits, lifts, stairs, escalators, toilets, bus stops and the surrounding streets. You can also download the sketches of the stops as a PDF file. A live info display will tell you whether the lifts are currently operating. On top of this you can access the details of arrangements for getting on and off trains or changing from a bus line to a train.

# Rapid transit and regional trains

# Our buses go down on their knees for you

Most of the buses in operation in Hamburg AB are kneeling buses, which lower the side of the bus next to the kerb. They have a ramp to allow passengers with walkers or prams to enter the bus easily. Kneeling buses also operate on the most frequently used routes outside Hamburg. You can identify the lines which run kneeling buses in the hvv timetables by the & symbol next to them.



# Getting on and off with a wheelchair

Please always use the doors in the middle of the bus. Just give a hand signal or press the button marked with the symbol when you want to get on or off. This is on the right of the central doors (outside) and in the area of the wheelchair space (inside). The bus driver will pull out the ramp for you as soon as the other passengers have got on or off. The ramps can bear a maximum weight of 250 kg, with newer buses 350 kg.

Mobility scooters can be taken on board buses if they fulfil certain conditions. Buses which can be used by passengers with mobility scooters are marked with a pictogram.
